FRENCH FIGHTER IS GOOD ACTOR, TOO

Carpentier Made Splendid Impression as Gentleman and Boxer at the Imperial.

Why Georges Carpentier, idol of France and heavyweight champion of Europe, has been called "the gentleman of the ring" is explained in convincing fashion in "The Wonder Man," the Robertson-Cole production which opened at the Imperial yesterday to immense crowds.

The picture, a remarkable one in many respects, is particularly noteworthy because of the fact that it shows for the first time in the history of the screen a pugilist who is as capable an actor as he is a fighter.

Carpentier, as the hero, plays the part of a French secret service man who is a gentleman and a boxer. He is shown in a realistic four-round bout with the villain of the picture, a screen actor, who is also a boxer.

It is impossible to imagine anything more unlike the conventional conception of a low-browed cat-in-the-hat, "brilliant" ring hero than this tall, slender, urbane and debonair young exquisite, flower-delled, six-foot suite at the Biltmore, his fondness for grand opera, his membership in all the best clubs in London and Paris, his cultivated taste in music, art and literature, and last—his well-bred, well-educated, attractive, girlishly charming wife.

That's why Carpentier is popular, that's evidently why he was acclaimed with applause at the theatre here yesterday. St. John people like to see exhibitions of the manly art of self-defence, but most of all they like to see it clean and gentlemanly.

"The Wonder Man" concludes its showing today. It is quite a change from the general run of pictures and both ladies and gentlemen seemed to enjoy it immensely.

GENERAL SMUTS HAS PLURALITY OF THIRTY-FOUR

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Johannesburg, South Africa, Feb. 14.—The returns from all constituencies in the Union of South Africa general elections are now in and the results are: General Smuts (secessionist), 44; Labor, 9; Democrat, 1; the rest seats 1/2 total, 134.

The two tied seats will have to be repolled and it gained will give the party of General Smuts a majority over all of twenty-six. If won by Nationalists, the loyalist majority, including Labor, would still be forty seats.
