London, June 5.—(Reuters).—Replying in the House of Commons to Norton Griffiths, Right Hon. Bonar Law said that the government intended that representation of the dominions in the League of Nations should be as full as that of the smaller sovereign nations. Representatives of the dominions would be eligible for appointment to the executive council on exactly the same terms as other members of the league who were not permanently represented thereon.

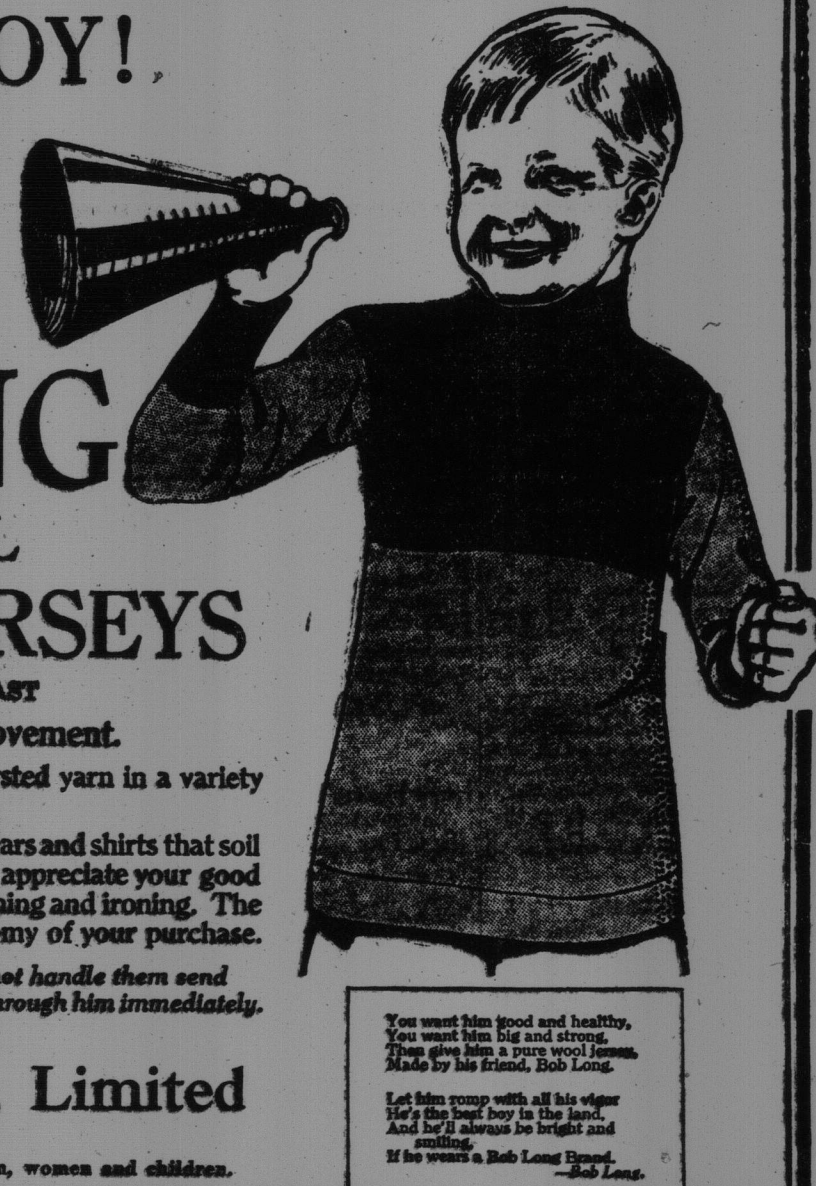

#### SOME FOREIGNERS ON VALLEY RAILWAY WORK GO OUT ON STRIKE

Fredericton, June 5.—A strike by alien navies employed on the St. John Valley Railway construction between Gagetown and Brown's Flat has taken place. The strikers are said to be Bulgarians and Indians employed by the Bedford Construction Company and who were not satisfied with their pay, which was said to be thirty cents an hour. They quit work yesterday when their employers refused thirty-five cents.

Chief Engineer C. O. Foss and Secretary E. S. Carter of the St. John & Valley Railway Company, provincial government representatives in the construction of the railway, together with members of the provincial government, reached the scene on an inspection of the railway soon after the strike occurred. Mr. Foss said today the strike would not be serious, and he does not expect it to develop sufficiently to delay handing the railway over to the Canadian National Railways for operation Aug. 1.

Only the navies were affected by the strike. Mr. Foss said they would either soon be replaced or else would drift back again within a short time. The steam shovel and ballasting work so far as it

is carried on by machinery was not affected, only the pick and shovel laborers quitting.

BRITISH COMMONS VOTES FOR PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE ON THE MATTER. London, June 5.—The House of Commons, after a two day debate, last night adopted a resolution in favor of appointing a parliamentary committee to examine and report upon a federal constitution applicable to England, Scotland and Ireland. The vote was 17 to 84.

The resolution declares that "with a view to enabling the imperial parliament to devote more attention to the interests of the kingdom and the empire the time has arrived for the creation of subordinate legislatures for

ENGLAND, SCOTLAND, IRELAND

THIRD READING FOR IMMIGRATION ACT AND SUPPLY BILL IN SENATE. Ottawa, June 5.—The government's immigration act was given a third reading in the senate yesterday.

The government's supply bill encountered considerable opposition. Senator Bostock said it provided for vast expenditures and that the senate should not be called upon to vote them without more detailed information.

Senator Ross (Middleton) said that a \$25,000,000 loan provision for good housing should not be in the supply bill at all, it should be an independent measure and be discussed in all its phases.

Senator Power said that, considering the financial situation, it was "simply an outrage" that expenditures such as some of those included in the supply bill should be made. The housing scheme was one of the most absurd ever put forward in this or any other parliament, and in his opinion, the gentlemen responsible for it should be examined by the medical authorities. The bill was given a third reading.

AGAINST HAVING WOMEN AS ANGLICAN SYNOD DELEGATES. Kingston, Ont., June 5.—The Ontario Anglican synod by an overwhelming vote declared yesterday against a proposal to allow women to attend as delegates. The attitude of those opposed to the proposal was that if women delegates were allowed many men would be inclined to absent themselves from meetings, knowing that they could count on the women to be present.

CALL ON TURKS TO KILL THE GREEKS IN THRACE. Saloniki, June 5.—A proclamation inviting the Turks to massacre the Greeks in Thrace has been distributed at Athina.

General Herbert, commanding the Third French army, has arrived here on a special mission.

GIVE UP HOPE FOR JAMES, CANADIAN ACE. New York, June 5.—Hope for the safety of Captain Mansel L. James, Canadian "ace" who disappeared on last Thursday while flying his biplane from Lew. Mass. to Minnola, was virtually abandoned last night.
