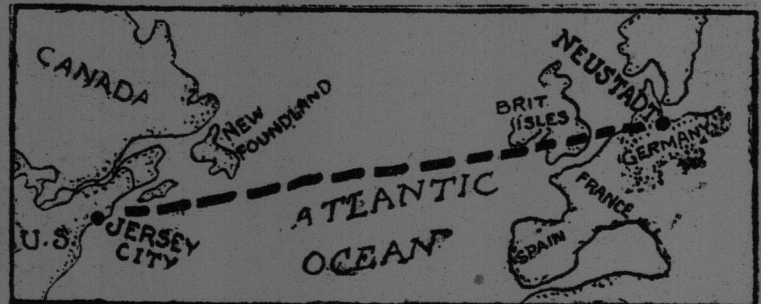


## MARCONI'S LONG DISTANCE TALK

## Tories Oppose Fair Play To Moncton and Eastward

(Moncton Transcript)

Our esteemed contemporary, The Chatham, N. B. World, still hangs away at the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway to Moncton, and in that respect it is a consistent supporter of Premier Fleming, who declares it to be "a colossal blunder." The World, however, does not see how the Liberals can condemn Mr. Fleming, for building the Valley Railway, but the Liberals do not condemn him or anybody else for building the Valley Railway. The Liberals in this section of the province take a broad view of the rights of other parts of the province to fair play and consideration, and are willing to give and take. The Moncton Liberals have even gone so far as to place on record their approval of the Valley Railway, but they object to the exclusion of the Grand Trunk Pacific in its construction to Moncton, from the favor of a premier, who should be impartial in his desire to develop all parts of the province. Here is what the Moncton Liberals at their Club meeting on Friday evening last by resolution declared, and in that resolution, they practically swept away the whole of the contention set forth by our Chatham contemporary. The resolution is as follows:

Moved by J. T. Hawke, seconded by R. A. Steves.

"That Whereas, the Hon. Mr. Fleming, premier of the province of New Brunswick, in a speech delivered at St. John a few days since, declared that the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway to the city of Moncton was a colossal blunder;

"And Whereas, he further declared that he was supporting the construction of the Valley Railway so-called as a means of correcting the alleged colossal blunder, caused by the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific to Moncton;

"And Whereas, the construction of the Valley Railway originally proposed under Liberal rule, was as a means of developing trade and commerce down the valley of the river St. John, which is a proposal standing upon its own merits, without any hostility towards the development of the central portion of the province and the connection of the Grand Trunk Pacific with the city of Moncton;

"Therefore, be it resolved, that this Moncton Liberal Club unanimously condemns the all manner of the Hon. Mr. Fleming's declaration that the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific to Moncton was a colossal blunder, as being an utterance unworthy of a statesman who, as premier, should be impartial towards all sections of the province in carrying out and supporting a policy of general development.

"And Therefore, be it further resolved, that this Club will with unremitting effort continue to oppose the present provincial government and seek to replace it by provincial statesmen, who

take a broad statesmanlike view of their duties respecting the development of the industrial, commercial and natural resources of the province, on lines consonant with the general well-being and not inimical to the interests of any section thereof."

But the Daily Gleaner of Fredericton is also heard from. It is even worse than The Chatham World. It fails to take into recognition the fact that there is a large portion of the province of New Brunswick, which has rights as well as the portion forming its constituency, and it also ignores that there is the great province of Nova Scotia lying beyond.

Here is what it says:— Had he (Premier Fleming) said that in building the road along the route chosen, the Laurier government, committed an infamous fraud, or a gigantic steal, he would have been a good deal nearer the truth, than when he described it as only a "blunder." Even "crime" would be better. The excuse was made at the time that to build the road down the St. John valley would cost an infinitely greater amount of money than to take it across the province.

What narrow sectionalism is displayed by our Fredericton Tory contemporary! What has the question of relative cost to do with the matter? The people of Nova Scotia have rights as well as the people of New Brunswick. This journal has never seen any logical objection to the construction of the Valley Railway, and giving the people of St. John an opportunity of shorter connection with the west, even if the grades be greater. Here we are willing to bear as a people, our share of the cost of constructing the Valley Railway, operated and controlled as a part of the Intercolonial Railway system, but on the other hand we take the ground that the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway to Moncton was an act of justice to this part of the province and to the outlying portions of Canada east of us.

## TRUE HEROISM

Evangelist McPherson's Sermon in Douglas Avenue Church Last Evening

Evangelist Lowell C. McPherson preached last evening in the Douglas Avenue Christian church on the subject, "True Heroism." Mark 12:41-44 and Mark 14:1-9 were the lesson passages of scripture. Mr. McPherson said in part:

"Here the Holy Spirit conspicuously records the heart-felt offerings of two inconspicuous women, and Jesus commended their acts, stating that what Mary of Bethany did would be published wherever His gospel would be preached. One of these women was a poor widow among the rich and the other was a woman whose unalloyed love for her Master prompted her to make Him an offering of the most costly material possession she had as an expression of her gratitude to Him. These women regarded not such offerings as sacrifice. Sincere devotion to God is never regarded by the one rendering it as a sacrifice.

"There were some standing by who measured what these women did by human standards of property and propriety. But Jesus' esteem of the heart is not of the intellect nor learning, nor bank stock. Expressive desire of over-burdened hearts overflowing in love is the richest offering to God. There is nothing too costly to express the most valuable thing in the world—disinterested love.

"Heroism is not always conspicuous. It is most often unregistered by mankind, but never passed by unnoticed by our Heavenly Father. There are hard-working fathers and mothers as true as steel to God and to their children, in prayer and love and industry, who are among the greatest heroes and heroines of earth. Heroism puts in peril the lower for the higher elements of our being.

"A cowardly man can never be a hero on occasions. Heroism must be in the very heart and fibre of a man. Then occasions discover to the world what God knows.

"It is cowardly to reject Jesus Christ, to justify scepticism and infidelity." "The Power of Faith" is the subject for this evening.

The representatives of the various organizations expressed their approval of the plan and agreed to support it. Mrs. E. A. Smith said that the Women's Canadian Club had decided to erect a monument to Lady LaTour on Fort Howe and that they would like to see the place converted into a park before they do so. The Women's Canadian Club, she said, is arranging for a St. John night early in December at which the history of the place will be dealt with.

It was decided that the Historical Society was the proper body through which to carry on further correspondence, and a committee consisting of Commissioner Agar, Archdeacon Raymond, George A. Henderson and A. M. Belding, was appointed to draw up resolutions expressing the sentiments of the meeting.
