Gavin Lang, the Rev. J. H. Mackerras, John L. Morris, Esq., and Judge Dennistoun, members of the Temporalities' Board.

### NEXT MEETING OF SYNOD.

An understanding was come to as to the time and place of next annual meeting of Synod.

The Rev. George M. Grant, M.A., Minister of St. Matthew's Church, Halifax, being present, was invited to sit and deliberate with the House, and was welcomed by the Moderator.

The Rev. Jacob Ellegood, a Minister of the Episcopal Church in this City, being present, was invited to sit and deliberate with the House.

### APPLICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

There was read an Extract Minute of the Presbytery of Ottawa, transmitting an application from the Rev. James Cleland, a Minister of the Presbyterian Church in the United States, and formerly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, to be admitted as a Minister of this Church. A similar application was made by the Presbytery of Hamilton in behalf of the Rev. E. W. Waits, an ordained Minister of the Primitive Methodist Church, and by the Presbytery of London in behalf of Mr. J. B. Taylor, a Probationer of the Canada Presbyterian Church. Messrs. Cleland, Waits and Taylor were referred to the Examining Committee.

The minutes of a meeting of the Commission of Synod, held at Toronto on January 22, 1873, were read and sustained.
