



BRANDIED CHOCOLATES.

W. C. T. U. Says They Are Sold at Wood stock-Sellers Should Be Prosecuted.

W. C. T. U. Says They Are Sold at Word-stock-Selters Should Be Prosecuted.
 At a meeting of the Women's Christian Temperance Union held in Woodstock on Tuesday the following resolution was drawn up and unanimously passed in regard to the prohibitio of selling brandied chocolates. It was as follows: "Whereas brandied candies are being extensively sold throughout this Province and the W. C. T. U. Auxiliary have information sufficient to convince them that they are sold in Woodstock, and whereas these candies have been analyzed by a government analysis and declared to contain eleven per cent. of absolute alcohol and over eighteen per cent. of proof spirits, each candy containing more than half a teasponful of this strong liquor; and whereas the Police Magistrate of London, Ont., has publicly announced that any one found guilty of selling these candies will be convicted of a vio lation of the license law and fined not less than fifty dollars, the members of this union would earnestly appeal to such in Woodstock, took as may have beer selling them, of though perhaps unconsoious of their dangerious nature, especially when sold to childrer ren, that they at once case selling in violation of the law and to the great danger of cur young people."


