

### FERRY STEAMER BURNED.

Big Blaze on Waterfront at Toronto  
—Damage \$25,000.

Toronto, Aug. 7.—A disastrous conflagration broke out early yesterday morning, resulting in the partial destruction of the wharves and offices of the Toronto Ferry Co. at the foot of Bay street, the partial demolition of the Turbine Co.'s building, which lies next, and the burning of the ferry boat Shamrock.

The steamer Turbinia, which was being moored at the wharf east of the burning buildings, had a narrow escape also. The crew, by strenuous exertions, were enabled to get steam up and move out into the bay in time to escape the flames.

The total loss caused by the fire will be about \$25,000, distributed as follows: Shamrock, with fittings, wiring, etc., \$20,000; waiting-rooms and wharf, \$4,000. The insurance was: Shamrock, \$10,000; waiting-rooms, wharf, etc., \$12,000.

### CROWD MOB TOURISTS.

Stone Visitors Whose Car Ran Over a Little Boy.

New York, Aug. 7.—A party of visitors touring the city in a sight-seeing automobile was mobbed by a crowd of several hundred persons yesterday when the machine carrying the sightseers accidentally ran over and killed a boy on the east side.

The sightseers were observing the monument in the foreign populated district when a little Italian boy, Tony Pasquerelli, taking a shortcut, ran into the automobile, fell beneath the wheels and was crushed to death.

A crowd gathered and rained showers of stones and bottles upon the sightseers, who fled from the machine. The crowd then tried to burn the machine, but was prevented by the arrival of police reinforcements.

### B. N. A. Act Amended.

London, Aug. 7.—(C.A.P.) The bill to amend the British North America Act in relation to provincial subsidies has finally amended, has passed the House of Commons.

There appears to have been some difficulty over the bill. The Imperial authorities omitted from their draft all reference to the "final and unalterable" feature of the scheme. This created the impression that it was the intention of the British Government to leave the matter open to further agitation by the provinces, particularly by British Columbia.

The Canadian ministers in England strongly objected to the bill in this form, and in consequence of the necessity for the recognition of the "final and unalterable" purpose of the arrangement the whole address of the Canadian Parliament, including the words in question, was made part of the bill in the form of a schedule.

### Caught the Pickpocket.

Buffalo, N.Y., Aug. 7.—Frederick Burton of Toronto, had an exciting struggle with a pickpocket yesterday morning at Main and Court streets.

While Mr. Burton was boarding a

troley car for Niagara Falls he felt a tug at his coat pocket. The fellow started up Main street. Burton chased the man for over a block and then the fellow put up a vicious struggle. The prisoner gave his name as Samuel Cohen, aged 19 years.

### Preyed on His Friends.

Ottawa, Aug. 7.—For many weeks the Ottawa police have been on the hunt for an office thief. Now they have arrested the son of a city alderman, Deshardins by name, and he was remanded at yesterday's police court.

The accused, so the police say, has been in the habit of operating in offices in the city, where his personal connections and family relations easily effected his entrance.

Cleveland, Ohio, Aug. 7.—According to private advices received Monday night by the leader from New York and Cincinnati, Ohio, the wealthy John D. Rockefeller has made possible the cure of meningitis.

Dr. Simon Flexner, New York, advises say, has discovered a serum which will cure the heretofore fatal disease.

### Job for Girouard.

London, Aug. 7.—The Government have decided to build four hundred miles of railroad in Northern Nigeria, with the object of colonizing the colony, and especially the cotton growing district.

The work of construction will be entrusted to Lieut.-Col. Sir Edmund P. C. Girouard and will take four years.

## TRAIN SIDE-SWIPED

Six Persons Killed on Pennsylvania Railroad.

### ENGINE THROWN OFF TRACK

Runaway Freight Car Caught Side of Express—Going at High Speed on Curve—Eighteen Passengers Also Badly Injured—Four Cars Were Wrecked—Whole Family Victims—Second Train in Ditch.

Pittsburg, Aug. 7.—The Titusville Express, southbound, on the Buffalo & Allegheny division of the Pennsylvania Railroad, was wrecked near Kelley's station, two miles from Kittanning, Pa., about 11:30 o'clock yesterday by being "side-swiped" by a freight car that had broken away from a northbound freight train.

The engine was derailed, and two baggage cars, a smoker and passenger car wrecked. At least six persons are dead and about 18 injured.

The train on leaving Kittanning was behind time and it is stated that it was running at high rate of speed. The accident occurred at a sharp curve of the road, which prevented the engineer from seeing any consist.
