It is gratifying to know that the Church in Saint Stephen is now not only self-sustaining, but contributes to our Mission funds, and it is hoped that other Churches now receiving aid may soon follow its example.

Notwithstanding what has been done, yet very much more remains to be accomplished, for which we need men and money.

Dear brethren, let us pray more earnestly, give more liberally, and work more faithfully in this great Home Mission enterprise.
