Champions Are
Playing in England
London, April 22.—In a special
women-against-men match held at
Stoke Poges today, the world-famous
British women's championship holder
from 1914 to 1920, defeated Cyril Trol-
ley of Oxford University, British
amateur champion for 1920, by a score
of six up and four to play. Miss
Alexia Sidding, United States wo-
man champion, was defeated by Mr.
R. H. DeMontgomery by 4 up and
3 to play.
