## LORD CHIEF JUSTICE DEFENDS PREMIER

May be Condemned by Judiciary for Making Political Speech.

London, April 26.—(Canadian Press Cable).—The recent condemnation of Lord Birkenhead, the Lord Chancellor, of members of the judiciary for making oratorical incursions into politics may, perhaps be brought up against the new Lord Chief Justice, Sir Gordon Hewart, last night in making his first out-of-court speech since his appointment to the bench, took the opportunity to make a vigorous defense of the Prime Minister. The incident is regarded as the more interesting from the fact that the speech was made on behalf of the funds of the Newspaper Press Organization. In his early years, Sir Gordon Hewart earned his living as a newspaper man.

"The Prime Minister, to whom the country owes a greater debt of gratitude than was ever owed in any country to any statesman, had, Lord Chief Justice said, "is daily, hourly surrounded with every weapon of criticism, insinuation and attack calculated to weaken his hand at the most perilous moment in the annals of Europe. Despite these things, it is a great and wonderful thing that there still remain, as will remain, good citizens who are prepared to bear the brunt of the political struggle."

Mauretania's Speed

The Cunard liner Mauretania is reported to be maintaining her record for speed on her present voyage, which commenced from New York on Tuesday. Transferred to Atlantic

The Canadian Pacific was advised by their Liverpool offices yesterday that the liner Empress of India, now competing for service, will arrive at Quebec about July 1, and sail again from that port for Liverpool on July 6. This steamer, which was originally intended to be the company's Pacific service, will be one of the largest steamships on the St. Lawrence route and is expected in size only by the Empress of France and Empress of Scotland, also in the Canadian Pacific service.—Montreal Gazette, 28th.

Dr. J. A. M. Hemmison has joined the West India steamer Chaleur as ship's surgeon, and sailed with the steamer for the south on her present trip. Dr. Avera, late of the R. M. S. P. line, who has joined the Chaleur as chief engineer, taking the place of W. J. Mitchell, who is returning to England after being with the company on this side of the Atlantic for three years.

Malden Trip to Canada

Quebec, April 30.—The largest steamer in the trans-Atlantic trade between Canada and Britain, the Empress of Scotland, 25,000 tons—arrived here this evening from Southampton on her maiden trip.

## BIG PRESBYTERIAN PARLIAMENT TO MEET WEDNESDAY

Meeting of General Assembly at Winnipeg Will be Forty-Eighth in History of the Church, Dating from Union of Its Different Wings in 1875—This Year's Gathering Promises to be One of Most Important in Years.

Toronto, April 28.—(By Canadian Press).—The annual meeting of the big Presbyterian Parliament of Canada, known by the official and dignified title of the General Assembly, will meet in Winnipeg on Wednesday, June 7, for a week or ten days' session. This important denominational gathering will be the 48th in the history of this Church, dating from the union of its different wings in 1875. The half-century anniversary of the united denomination is, therefore, rapidly approaching.

This will be the fourth time the assembly has met in Winnipeg, the first was in 1887, when it was a very small and crude town, and the last in the prairies. Its turn came again in 1897, 1908 and 1916. Two of the moderators of the Winnipeg meetings still survive in Rev. S. P. Dyer, D.D., and Rev. A. B. Baird, D.D., who are still citizens of a city which has grown to cosmopolitan proportions, with a population nearing 200,000.

Every Assembly is important, based on its programme, and this will be no exception to the rule. A church with a programme that has a financial turnover in a year of \$11,000,000; that has 2,000 ministers and 4,000 congregations; that conducts nearly as many Sunday schools, with an enrolment of 520,000 officers and teachers, is a big business in itself. When there is added the work of 325 missionaries in eleven foreign fields—in China, Korea, Formosa, India and the British West Indies—it will be seen that the programme of this denomination, outside the bounds of Canada, is an immense one, especially when it is realized that modern missions work is not confined to direct evangelization, although that is the basis of the work, but includes educational and other phases of Christian service of the highest quality. The reports of these varied activities, as well as the messages from the missionaries on furlough, will, in itself, provide a long agenda.

Chief among the subjects for report and discussion, naturally, will be the Church Union; following the vote of the General Assembly of 1921, further confirming the proposed organic amalgamation of the Presbyterian, Methodist and Congregational bodies, following the truth of non-controversy, observed during the war.

Since that time, the committee on union, representing the three denominations, has met and passed the following resolution: "That a standing committee on law and legislation be appointed to consider and report on the legislation necessary to give effect to the union of the negotiating churches and to have prepared copies of all proposed bills to be submitted to the Parliament of Canada, and to
