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HORTICULTURE THE HOME GARDEN

How to Plan and Plant Common Vegetables.

"Sow early in April or May," is the stereotyped direction to the grower on every packet of seeds sent out by the seed men, but taking the average season and the average garden plot in the city in all kinds of situations and all kinds of soils and its varying conditions, may be the best time to put in your seeds.

THE POULTRY BUSINESS

As I have taken care of poultry for 18 years, I wish to give a few hints to those who might be about to begin the business.

After hens have been nesting a day, I would advise the beginner to start with more than forty fifty fowls.

If one wishes to raise chickens for sale, I think the Plymouth Rocks are good, as the chicks can be made to weigh two pounds much sooner than some other kinds.

As to setting hens, I have never made a row, one above another, with clean fresh nests, but I have seen it done through the cleats, to close the nest.

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GENERAL CROP ROTATION

Should Be Practiced More Universally by Maritime Province Farmers.

In order to get the best results from a field a crop rotation is absolutely necessary. By rotation we mean a regular succession of different crops, returning in a certain number of years to the first crop used.

Not long ago I heard a farmer make the remark that it would be impossible for him to follow a rotation because to do so he would have to plant one-third of his farm in roots, which would be a larger quantity than he could possibly make use of.

This man probably thought that a three-year rotation of first year roots, second year grain, and third year, was the only possible system. On the contrary, there is a large number of different combinations which may be used, varying in length from three to eight or nine years.

Each farmer must select the crop best suited to his needs. If he requires a large quantity of roots, the three-year system mentioned above would be the best.

If he wants more grain he might use the Norfolk system, first year grain, second year roots, and third year, corn. Each farmer must select the crop best suited to his needs.

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ASPARAGUS CULTURE

How to Grow This Crop in Home Gardens.

In every home garden there should be an asparagus bed. This vegetable is one of the earliest to be ready for use when the products of the garden are eagerly awaited.

It prefers a light sandy loam and responds readily to liberal feeding. When once planted, an asparagus bed is good for fifteen years or more.

The plants may be raised from seed, but it is better to buy strong two-year-old roots from a seedman or nurseryman.

The two best varieties are "Palmetto" and "Conover's Green". I have grown asparagus for many years, and find it one of the most valuable features of my home garden.

I plant it in early spring. The land where the roots are to be planted is heavily manured and ploughed deeply.

In small gardens where the plants are crowded, it is better to do a double row, with a space between the beds for setting.

I furrow out the rows about six inches deep, about four feet apart and set the plants at the bottom of the furrow, about fourteen inches apart and cover firmly with about four inches of soil.

The furrows become filled with water, and the plants are kept in a moist soil. The plants are kept in a moist soil.

The same is true of ducks and geese. They are equally susceptible to disease and require the same care. The duck that lays a strong fertilized egg is the one that is most valuable.

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
