## NOTES AND NEWS.

### UNITED STATES.

Nothing better illustrates the down-hill tendency of American youths than the fact that one company at Montpelier sold 11,000 studs for children last winter.

'Tis true that 2,000,000 bushels of peanuts are every year devoured in the United States, most of them by pale, heart-broken young ladies.

During the last four years, as shown by the records, 560 men and 9,066 women have been committed to the work-house on Blackwell's Island, New York, each from six to one hundred times for habitual intemperance.

One man and twenty-nine women have thus been committed one hundred times. The record is a sickening one, and all the more so as showing how numerous and repeatedly otherwise "lovely women" can "stoop to folly."

Says the New York Tribune, "We only tell Congress a plain, wholesome truth when we say that from one end of the United States to the other the common opinion is the District Government is nothing but an organization of Swindling Rings and other rackets, etc.,—in which members of the Senate and House and high officers of the United States have a pecuniary interest."
