OTTAWA, September 16 (The Canadian Press) — President El Hadj Ahmadou Ahidjo of the Republic of Chad, who arrived in Ottawa on September 15, visited the Prime Minister, Mr. Pierre Trudeau, and the President of the Senate, Mr. Jean-Jacques Bertrand, on September 16.

The President of Chad, who is on a state visit to Canada, will be accompanied by his wife and two children. He will be in Ottawa from September 15 to 19. The Prime Minister, Mr. Trudeau, and the President of the Senate, Mr. Bertrand, will be accompanied by their wives. The visit is part of a series of visits between Canada and Chad.
