S. of Thomas and Mary B. Eyre, formerly of Launceston, Cornwall, Eng., who came to Can. 1832. B. at Launceston, June, 1824. Ed. at Cobourg. M., 1856, Calista A., dau. of Samuel and Eliza Stevens, and grand-d. of the late Bishop John Reynolds. Admitted as an Attorney, U.C., 1851. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. for present seat.—*Brighton, Ont.*

FERGUSON, Major THOMAS ROBERTS, J.P. [*Simcoe, S.R.*] (See *House of Commons.*)

FERRIER, Lieut.-Col. ALEXANDER DAVID, J. P. [*Wellington, C. R.*]

Second s. of the late Louis Henry Ferrier, Esq., of Belleside, Linlithgowshire, Scot., who was Collector of Customs at Quebec, and died there in 1833, by Charlotte, dau. of Dr. Alex. Monro, Prof. of Anatomy in Edinburgh University. B. in Edinburgh, 13 Nov., 1813. Ed. at the Edinburgh Academy and University. M., 1850, Magdalene Dingwall Fordyce Ward, dau. of the late A. D. Fordyce, Esq., first Warden of the Wellington District. Has been a mem. of the County Council; and is now County Clerk, which office he has held since Jan., 1849. Was a Commissioner of the Court of Requests from 1838 until it was abolished. Served at the Frontier with the Fergus Volunteer Rifles, during the Rebellion of 1837-8. Raised the 6th Batt. Wellington Militia, from which he retired in 1862, retaining his rank as Lieut.-Col. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e.—*Fergus, Ont.*
