Ottawa, March 15, 1913.

Referring to your letter of Jan. 21, last, and previous correspondence, I beg to inform you that the Canadian Pacific Railway is willing to sell part of the land at Brockett in the Peigan Indian Reserve for which application has been made by the Department but that they will require to retain a width measured South from the centre line. The company in fact is willing to sell all the land at Brockett and Peigan siding retaining only one hundred and fifty feet in width on the North of the and 250 feit conth centre line but the Railway Company is contemplating a change in the location of their line and it is thought that this matter should stand for a short time until the Company's plans are fully matured. The matter will therefore stand for the present; kindly bring it up again at a future date.
