Uplands, Ontario	1st October 1943		Cloudy to overcast, light rain. Wings Parade for Course 83. A large group of friends of the graduates saw Group Captain Raymond, the Commanding Officer, present the Wings to graduates of this Course. Following the parade, the graduates and guests were entertained at the Drill Hall and at the Officers' Mess. Group Captain Raymond also read letters of commendation from the Chief of the Air Staff to Squadron Leader A.D. Haylett, Flight Sergeant Thompson, R.E.H., and LAC Jardine, W.J. of this Station, in connection with their action at the time of a collision in mid-air and subsequent fire in the vicinity of the aerodrome. A similar letter has been forwarded to LAC Sylvester, K.L., at RCAF Station, Gander, Nfld., for his actions at that time.	
	2nd October 1943		Mostly overcast. Monthly dance at Officers' Mess enjoyed by many members and their guests, including the Commanding Officer and party. The usual Saturday evening movie, "Reveille with Beverly", starring Ann Miller, was presented in the Recreation Hall.	
	3rd October 1943		Cloudy to overcast. Church services in morning. Flying in P.M. only.	
	4th October 1943		Partly cloudy. A visit was paid to this Station by Flight Lieutenant Kuttelwascher and Squadron Leader J. Jaske, Czechoslovakian Air Force; accompanied by the Commanding Officer, the party proceeded to the Recreation Hall where Flight Lieutenant Kuttelwascher addressed the students and flying personnel on his experiences on night intruder operations.	
	5th October 1943		Partly cloudy. The regular movie in the Recreation Hall "Street of Chance", with Burgess Meredith and Claire Trevor, was enjoyed by a large Station audience.	
	6th October 1943		Mostly clear. Mr. and Mrs. Patterson, Mr. John O'Donnell and Mr. Richard Clarke of the New York News were visitors to the Station and were shown around by the Commanding Officer.	J.M.
