Your letter of 19th ult just arrived on yesterday's mail. I regret very much that I did not know of your willingness to accept the situation as when I was at Quathiaski cove in August I could easily have run over to see you. You are somewhat in error in stating that the appointment rests in my hands. The School is under the management of the Church Missionary Society who appoint their own staff subject to the approval of the Department. At that time however I was commissioned by them to get a man for the position and met with considerable difficulty in doing so and certainly had I known that you would have accepted the position I should have given it to you without any hesitation. I managed however to get a man by the name of Carter who is at present filling the position but should any vacancy occur I certainly will recommend you to the Mission.

I will try and see you on my next visit to that section of the country which will be probably late in the month or early in next.
