# From the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to His Majesty's Representative at Moscow

## FOREIGN OFFICE, SW.1, March 24, 1926.

SIR,—I transmit to you herewith a copy of a despatch from the Governor General of Canada to the Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs regarding the Canadian share of the seals taken on the Russian Seal Islands under the Fur Seals Protection Convention of 1911 concluded between Great Britain, the United States of America, Russia and Japan.

2. I shall be glad if you will make a request of the Soviet Government for information as to the sealing operations carried on on the Russian seal islands since 1920 inclusive.

3. As you are no doubt aware, His Majesty's Government consider that the Convention remains in force as between them and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. I would add, for your own information, that during the negotiations of 1924 the Soviet representatives specifically mentioned the Convention as one of those which they would wish to see continued in force. It will probably be inadvisable for you to make use of this last fact in communications with the Soviet authorities, since to do so might lead them to infer a weakening in the view of His Majesty's Government as to the continued validity of other treaties.
