The new power and authority which
accorded to Canada — through her military
and economic might — was not the result of
the seeking after glory — or the desire to
impose her will upon others.

Nonetheless — Canada subscribed
to the Charter of the United Nations —
whose high purposes are succinctly stated
in Articles 55 and 56;—

55. "With a view to the creation of
conditions of stability and well-being
which are necessary for peaceful and
friendly relations among nations based
on respect for the principle of equal
rights and self-determination of peoples,
the United Nations shall promote —"
