and if he remains in the employment for the period which he was, pursuant to this part, directed or requested to remain, he shall be deemed to have repaid the full amount of the advance.

- a person to take employment which involves a change of residence and requires him to be separated from his dependents, and the earnings from the employment are not, in the opinion of the Selective Service Officer, sufficient to compensate him for the increased cost of living occasioned by the separation, the Selective Service Officer may, in accordance with principles and directions set out in instructions from the Director, pay him a supplementary living allowance not exceeding five dollars for each week he is in such employment.
- (4) Where a Selective Service Officer directs or requests a person to take employment at a lower remuneration than he is receiving, the Selective Service Officer may, in accordance with principles and directions set out in instructions from the Director, pay him a supplementary allowance not exceeding five dollars for each week he is in such employment.
- (5) Where a Selective Service Officer directs or requests a person to take employment, he may, in accordance with principles and directions set out in instructions from the Director, advance him an amount not exceeding fifteen dellars to defray living expenses during the first week of employment, and the person to whom such advance is made shall repay the amount thereof to the Selective Service Officer within forty-eight hours from receiving his first normal wages or salary from the employment or within such further period as the Selective Service Officer may allow.
- (6) Payments under this section shall be made by the Comptroller of the Treasury on the request of the Selective Service Officer, or, in the Director's discretion, by the Selective Service Officer out of moneys advanced to him for the purpose.
