- Population The Inds did not furnish their present pop. The Royal Com gives 102 (I have allowed 100)
- Chief occupations The same as Pemberton & Somokum bands.
- " products sold. do do do.
- Markets for products. chiefly local & restricted
- Number of stock Horses & cattle 40. like the Somokum band stock shows a considerable increase since time of com. (see reports p 40. R.C.)
- Number of reserves 4
- Area do 826 acres = abt. $8\frac{1}{4}$ acres per cap
- Valuation do (by H. C. \$33,700 = abt. \$37⁰⁰ per cap.
- Location & condition } (see Royal Com report.)
Facilities of access etc } (do)
- Situation as to altitude, climate etc. Same as the Samahquam reserves but owing to the light nature of the soil irrigation is required in several places.
- What best adapted for. Similar to Samahquam but owing to character of soil many portions of reserves not well adapted for certain kinds of crops.
- Approx. population of reserves unfit for cultivation
- " " cultivable 40 to 50 acres ^{abt. 24 per cent} _{6 per cent}
- " " cultivated ^{= abt 1/2 acre per cap or less} practically all available
- " " pasture practically no pasture excepting a very little in timbered lands & in fields in fall.
- " " timbered Most of the lands are timbered perhaps half or less commercial timber.
