

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may be homestended by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or legs.

or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy, may however, he made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cul-tivation of the land in each year for three years.

of A homesteader may, if he desires, perform the required idence duties by living on ming land owned solely by residence dut farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint owner-ship in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farm-ing land owned by himself must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
