A JUBILEE MISSION FOR THE LOYAL CRUSADERS.

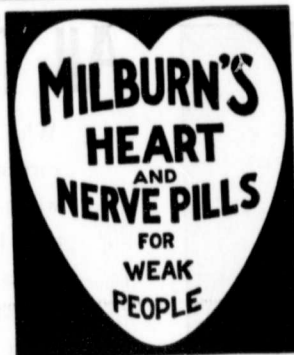

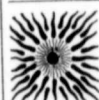
