"I believe that this nation should frankly state to Germany that we are willing to apply in this case the...

"These treaties negotiated under this administration make war practically impossible between this...

"This plan was offered to all nations without any exception whatever, and Germany was one of the nations...

"No treaty was actually entered into with Germany, but I cannot see that that should stand in the...

"Such an offer, if accepted, would at once relieve the tension and silence all jingoes who are demanding...
