DEATH OF HON. W. A. BLACK.—It becomes our painful duty to record the sudden death of the Hon. W. A. Black, Esq., of this city, which took place at his residence, Bellevue, on Saturday evening last. Mr. Black was one of the oldest members of the Legislative Council, from which position he retired, in consequence of ill health, in 1854.

THE LAKESIDE PLOT.—The Cleveland Herald says the ringleader of the pirates who seized the steamer Michigan is a man named Charles H. Cole. He appeared in Cleveland about six weeks ago, made a large display of gold entered into negotiations for the purchase of two schooners, pretended to be very loyal, and made the acquaintance of the officers of the United States steamer Michigan.
