ORDERED, that Mr. Speaker do issue his Warrant, to the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, to make out a new Writ for the electing of a Knight to serve in this present Provincial Parliament, for the County of *Surrey*, in the room of the said *Pierre Bedard*, Esquire.
