- Resolved, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that a House of Correction is necessary for the Diffrict of Montreal.
- RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that a House of Correction is necessary for the District of Three Rivers.
- RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that a Committee of five Members be appointed to bring in a Bill to provide temporary Houses of Correction in the different Districts of this Province.
 - On motion of Mr. Mure, seconded by Mr. Coffin;
- ORDERED, that the question of concurrence be now put on the said resolutions.

And the faid resolutions being again severally read, and the question of concurrence being separately put upon each, they were agreed to by the House.

- RESOLVED, that this House doth agree with the foregoing resolutions, reported from the Committee.
- ORDERED, that Mr. Joseph Bedard, Mr. Coffin, Mr. Henry, Mr. Debartzch, and Mr. Solicitor General, do compose the said Committee.
 - On motion of Mr. Mure, seconded by Mr. Archambault;
- ORDERED, that it be an instruction to the said Committee, to enquire into the extent of the old and new Gaols of Quebec, and Montreal, and of the average number of Prisoners confined in the old Prisons for the last seven years, and report the same to this House, with their opinion if the new Gaols are sufficiently extensive that a part thereof, when completed, may be appropriated to the purposes of Houses of Correction; and that they have power to send for persons, papers and records.
