The Administrator in Chief has directed to be laid before the Legislative Council, the plans made by a person appointed by the late Governor in Chief, of a Bridge over the River St. Maurice, together with a statement and estimate of the probable expense of the erection thereof.

The Administrator in Chief also informs the Legislative Council, that in pursuance of the 5th Section of the Act for the improvement of the internal communications, he caused measures to be taken for procuring plans and estimates of the expence necessary for rendering the river Richelieu navigable, from Chambly to St. John's; but the only person who offered to undertake the survey, having demanded nearly the whole sum granted by the Legislature for the purpose, the Administrator in Chief thought it expedient to decline the proposal, conceiving the terms of it to be exorbitant and that no choice of plans would thereby be afforded as contemplated by the Legislature.
