The said Bill was read for the first time, pro formâ.

The Honorable the Speaker reported His Excellency's Speech from the Throne, and

The same was then read by the Clerk.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ross, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Tache, it was

Ordered, That the House do take into consideration the Speech of His Excellency the Governor General on Monday next.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ross, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Boulton, it was

Ordered, That two hundred and fifty copies of the Speech of His Excellency the Governor General be printed in both languages, for the use of Members.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ross, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Vankoughnet, it was

Ordered, That the Honorable Messieurs Moore, J. Morris, Taché, Seymour, Dessaulles, Patton and Ross, be appointed a Committee to examine and report upon the Contingent Accounts of the Legislative Council for the present Session.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ross, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Boulton, it was

Ordered, That the Honorable Messieurs Hamilton, Matheson, Murney, Hollis Smith, Dionne and Ross, be appointed a Committee to peruse and perfect the Journals of this and former Sessions of the Provincial Parliament.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ross, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Vankoughnet, it was

Ordered, That the Honorable Messieurs Boulton, Perry, Armstrong, Masson, Ferrie, Prince, Simpson, Cartier, Wilson and Ross, be appointed a Committee to superintend the Printing of this House during the present Session.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ross, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Taché, it was

Ordered, That all the Members present this day, or who shall be present this Session, be appointed a Committee to consider of the Orders and Customs of this House and Privileges of Parliament, and that the said Committee have leave to meet in this House, when and as often as they please.

Then on motion of the Honorable Mr. de Blaquière, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Patton,

The House was adjourned until Monday next, at three o'clock in the afternoon.
