LIVE STOCK MARKETS
TORONTO.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards yesterday consisted of 1 car—1336 cattle, 90 calves, 424 hogs and 22 sheep and lambs.

For a Monday market, the run was small, with a few over 1300 cattle of all grades on sale.

Trade was decidedly strong, with butcher steers and heifers, cows and bulls all selling at prices 25c to 40c higher than a week ago, and in some cases 50c more was paid.

Corbett, Hall & Coughlin sold 2 choice baby beef, 790 lbs. each, at \$12.25.

McDonald & Halligan sold 23 steers, 1140 lbs. each, at 12 1/2; 16 steers, 1325 lbs., at 12.

Rice & Whaley sold 18 steers, 1280 lbs. at \$12.10, and Dunn & Leveck sold 16 steers, 1240 lbs., at \$12 per cwt., the balance of butchers selling at from \$10 to \$11.85 per cwt.

Choice cows sold at from \$9.75 to \$10 with a few at \$10.25 to \$10.50 per cwt. Bulls sold at \$10 to \$10.50 (for choice, and \$9.50 to \$9.75 for good).

Stockers and feeders were again slow, very little business in this line being transacted. We repeat that it is a good time for intending purchasers to visit the yards.

Milkers and springers were also slow. What few were on sale, however, brought steady prices. Best cows sold at from \$90 to \$110, a few real choice selling at \$116 to \$126 each.

Sheep, lambs and calves all sold at prices steady with last week's close.

Hogs sold at \$11.90, fed and watered, a few selects at \$16, and weighed off cars at \$16.15. Packers state that the price will be 25c lower today.

The North Carrick Red Cross.

After a series of earnest and enthusiastic meetings in the homes of the members, had their closing meeting for the season at the home of Mr. J. A. Hutton on Wed. night April 4 when a shower was donated for the good of the cause.

The donations consisted of 3 sheets 19 pillow cases, 16 towels, 31 housewives, 30 personal property bags, 8 khaki handkerchiefs, 9 lbs. toilet soap, besides honey and sausage each in small cans, sugar in small bags, cocoa, oxo cake, candy cookies, summer sausage etc.

The ladies packed 9 boxes for boys overseas using the eatables donated besides putting in each boy's socks, a towel, soap, a handkerchief, and a housewife filled with its necessities. The boxes were valued at \$3.00 each. The rest of the donations were shipped to the C. R. C. S. Toronto.

During the winter the workers have made—21 flannel shirts, 20 pyjama suits 34 helpless shirts, 15 towels, 165 pairs of socks, and 3 quilts besides the items in the shower.
