SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-
WEST LAND REGULATIONS
ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a
family, or any male over 18 years old,
may homestead a quarter section of avail-
able Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskat-
chewan or Alberta. The applicant must
appear in person at the Dominion Land
Agency or Sub-Agency for the District.
Entry by proxy may be made at any
holder, son, daughter, brother or sister
of the homesteader.
Duties—Six months' residence upon and
cultivation of the land in each of three
years. A homesteader may live within
fifty miles of his homestead on a farm of
at least 80 acres, solely owned and occu-
pied by him or by his father, mother, son,
daughter, brother or sister.
In certain districts a homesteader in
good standing may pre-empt a quarter-
section along side his homestead. Price
of the homestead or pre-emption six months
in each of six years from date of home-
stead entry (including the time required
to earn homestead patent), and cultivate
50 acres extra.
A homesteader who has exhausted his
homestead right, and cannot obtain a pre-
-emption in certain districts, price \$3.00 per
acre. Duties—Must reside six months in
each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and
open a house worth \$300.00.
