SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

FREE sole land of a family, or any man over 25 years old, may homestead all land must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. As the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after entering homesteaded land; also 60 acres extra cultivation. Free emption patent may be obtained as soon as homesteaded land is surveyed.

Qualifications—Six months residence upon acquisition of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within six miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Residence in certain districts a homesteader is required to pre-empt a quarter-section adjacent to his homestead. Price \$10.00 per acre.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased home stand in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

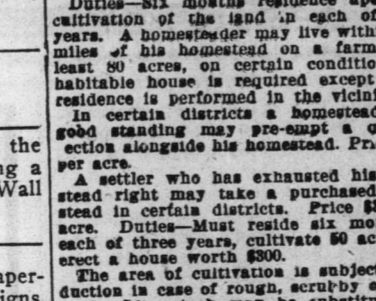

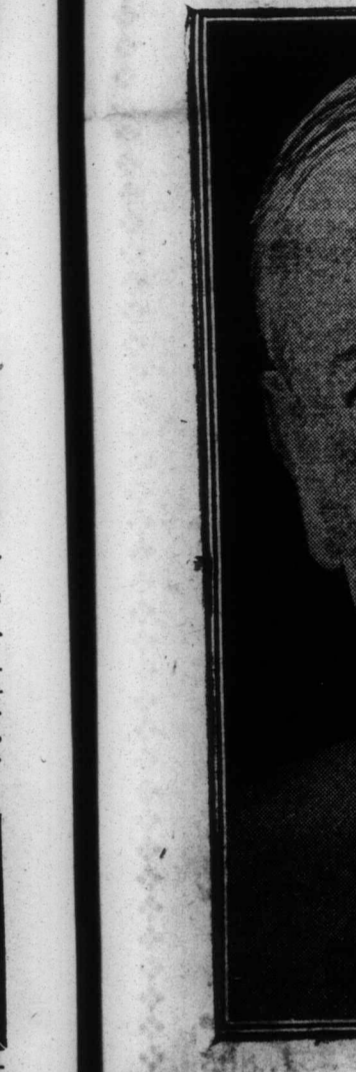
