To Cross the Atlantic in an Airship

A despatch from Paris says:—When interviewed regarding the vast projects he has in mind, Santos-Dumont, the Brazilian seronaut, said: "First of all I am going down to the Rivera to continue my experiments there, I shall build a shed on the coast, take my airship apparatus and workmen with me, and make for Corsica at a given time. I shall ask the postfi authorities to give me a measage for delivery at a certain point on the island and shall xace the mail boat, and, what is more, I shall sheat it.

"I am not afraid of falling into the sea. I shall not drown for my apparatus will be enveloped in a covering of impermeable silk, and I shall float. Afterwards I shall try to cross the Mediterranean to Tunis. If I be successful in these trips I shall consider the possibility of crossing the Atlantic.

"I will take me considerable less time to go from Europe to America than a transatlantic liner. If I had a strong, steady wind behind me such as sometimes blows across the Atlantic, I might go from Paris to New York in two days."
