(The metric system would in time take the place of the present systems of measurement for liquids, weights and distances, all over the civilized world. The beauty of the metric system was its uniformity, which made it very simple to understand. All the older nations of the world had either taken the system up or were contemplating doing so. All the European nations with the exception of Great Britain and Russia were adopting the metric system. A bill is at present before the Congress ed, will adopt the metric system in that country.
