Roping Hay.
 Roping hay will soon be on, I will use the method of harvesting I noticed in some parts of the year last year which I consider a saving of labor. The hay, red, is raked into windrows, rope or chain, about 30 feet laid with the centre on the window; the horses are on each side and hitched up end of the rope; the left end long, so that they amble over the hay.
