KING LEOPOLD LEFT ESTATE OF \$56,000,000

Baroness Vaughan, His Majesty's widow, is the largest beneficiary. Left Only \$3,000,000 to His Children—Life Story of This King, Financier, Slave-driver and Libertine.

Paris, Dec. 21.—King Leopold of Belgium, left an estate of \$56,000,000, according to documents from Paris. Of this, \$6,000,000 is in art-treasures and jewels. Headed by Princess Louise, the Royal family has taken steps to contest for the fortune in the courts. Baroness Vaughan, to whom he has left the bulk of the estate; the Society Immobiliere Anonyme, headed by Leopold, and the Congo Royal Endowment will be the defendants. It is believed that Leopold transferred this property before his death, as the will mentioned only \$3,000,000 he received from his father, which he in turn bequeathed to his children.

Sketch of the Dead King. Leopold II, King of the Belgians, was the son of the late King Leopold I, upon whose death he succeeded to the throne as Leopold II. He was born in Brussels April 9, 1835, and married August 22, 1859, the Arch-Duchess Maria of Austria, by whom he had three children—two daughters and one son, the Duke of Brabant, who died in 1869, aged ten years. In 1865, in company with the Duchess of Brabant, he made a lengthy tour through Europe, Egypt and Asia Minor.

As the Duke of Brabant he took a prominent part in several important discussions in the senate, especially in that relating to the establishment of a maritime service between Antwerp and the Levant. His Majesty visited England very frequently. He took a great interest in the development of the Congo Free State and was the originator of a national association, which was formed to open up the Congo river and its tributaries. In this connection he was brought into the view over the exposures of horrible atrocities among the natives of the Congo Free State, a charge that was laid upon him by several of the nations, Britain included.

Having no son living, and the daughters being excluded from the throne, the Belgian constitution, the elder son of his brother, the Comte de Flandre, was heir presumptive to the throne, and he died January 23, 1891, aged 36. His only son, Prince Albert, who is thirty years of age, the only brother of the late Prince Baldwin, was named as heir presumptive. Leopold undoubtedly inherited much of his propensity to drive sharp bargains from his father, the late King Louis Philippe, of France. The latter was wont, during the eighteen years of his reign, to run the government of France in a manner calculated to promote his speculations on the stock exchange, sacrificing the interests of the nation, without the slightest hesitation, to the requirements of those coups de bourse by means of which he managed to accumulate a colossal fortune. King Leopold, in a similar manner, followed the same course which the administration would be led by him to adopt, in questions of domestic and foreign policy, to possess over other gamblers in stocks an immense advantage, of which he never failed to avail himself.

How He Got Rich. True Leopold, in a very handsome profit, amounting to several millions of francs, by unloading his "Pounders" shares in the old Panama Canal company, and by selling his Mexican bonds at the beginning of the '90s. But his ventures in connection with the Belgian Congo Free State Company were unprofitable, and he was only during the last ten years that his investments in the various Congo rubber companies, the Belgian-Japanese Trading Company, and in his scores of undertakings in China, Persia and Russia began to pay.

Interested in South Africa. At one time he was extensively interested in South African concerns, especially at Johannesburg, and prior to the outbreak of the Boer war, displayed much sympathy for the Transvaal, with the idea of promoting his undertakings in the Boer republic. Indeed, so pronounced was his friendship for President Kruger and his government, that his agents in Europe, Dr. Leyds, was encouraged to establish his "Legation" at Brussels, rather than at the Hague, and to make it the headquarters of his anti-English propaganda in behalf of the Boer republics.

Grubbing Was Taxes. But when the latter commenced to impose crushing war taxes upon the foreign mining concerns at Johannesburg, in order to provide for the needs of war, Leopold's sympathy diminished, and as soon as he realized that the control of the mines and the Orange Free State was destined to pass into the hands of England, he at once changed his attitude toward the latter, and began to court and his myrmidons, and sent Dr. Leyds, bag and baggage, out of Brussels. This, however, did not affect Belgium, one way or another, indeed it cannot be said that Leopold had ever deliberately subordinated the political interests of his country to his private undertakings, save in one particular, namely, in endeavoring to drive too hard a bargain

universally respected and liked, he was destined to restore the prestige of monarchy in Belgium, which is now at its lowest ebb, thanks to the unpopularity of that disappointed and embittered old man, the late King Leopold II.

IS CANADA'S IDEA OF LIBERTY PERVERTED. Henri Bourassa Delivers Notable Speech in Montreal on National Defense—Advices Canada to Pass Before Finally Adopting New Principles of Empire Defense.

Montreal, Dec. 21.—At the annual dinner of the Dominion Commercial Travellers Association tonight, Mr. Henri Bourassa made a notable speech upon the problem of national defense. He said that Canada's idea of liberty was becoming too much like that of the United States, whose people talked of liberty and practiced it, providing everybody's idea of liberty was the same as theirs. It was necessary to give up the idea that a man the making of them and this must differ from the majority. National defense meant new problems of diplomatic and relationship and the French Canadians were ready to study it, but having renounced all allegiance to their own mother land and following the oldest Canadians they had a right to demand that these questions be studied from the point of view of Canada and not from that of the Anglo-Saxon world.

Resented His Immorality. The Belgian nobles resented the disdain of Leopold for the proprieties and conventionalities of life, his treatment of his wife and children, and the scandals of a moral and of a business character in which he had at one time or another been involved, and which he has visited upon Belgium's people who only claim to notice, chiefly unalterable, was that they had temporarily secured his will, through his business interest.

Excellent Architect. He was also an excellent architect, and took a leading part in designing the rebuilding of Laeken after its almost total destruction by fire. He cared nothing for shooting or hunting, was indifferent to racing, and, indeed, to every other form of sport, save the shooting of birds and the haute finance. The latter, indeed, was the one absorbing passion of his life. Democratic in his manner, he was a democrat as he was a descendant of Henry IV. of France, and resenting contradiction and opposition, was indignantly rebuffed by the Federal government.

Will Again Submit Money Bill to Finish City Hall. Calgary, Dec. 21.—The city council last night voted to disburse with the services of Architect Wood, the report of the special city hall committee, recommending this course. A bylaw will be submitted to the ratepayers authorizing more debentures to finish the building. The council took this action in spite of the opposition of A. K. Watson and Ald. Horby, who voted negatively for the bylaw, but they believed it would be wiser to leave the matter in the hands of the new council, instead of incurring the expense of doing it and his friends at this time.

Penry Novelist a Highwayman. Dresden, Dec. 21.—Dr. Carl May, a Dresden novelist and millionaire, who frequently has been a guest of King Frederick Augustus, of Saxony, and who is an acquaintance of Emperor William, is publicly accused by Dresden newspapers of being the identical "Old May," who was sentenced in 1860 to eight years at hard labor in prison for highway robbery. The convicted May was a notorious footpad and swindler and burglar. He fled the country when the police got on his trail. The accusing newspaper says May returned some years later and began writing the class of novel called in England "Penry Redfalls."
