### Caronia Here and Gone

The R. M. S. Caronia, Capt. E. J. Diggle, R.D., R.N.R., arrived from Liverpool via Belfast at 7.30 yesterday morning after a passage of 4 1/2 days. Fine weather was met with throughout the trip. On arrival the ship anchored in the stream, following which the Furness Withy tug "Hugh D." proceeded alongside and transferred her passengers for this port to the shore. The Caronia is a steel twin screw of 19,877 gross and 10,305 net. Her dimensions are 550 feet long, 72.2 feet beam and 49.2 feet beam. She was built in 1905 by Messrs. J. Brown and Company, Clydebank and is owned by the Cunard S. S. Company. The ship had on board 221 cabin and 319 third class passengers, of which 52 cabin and 20 third class passengers were landed here. The Caronia continued the voyage from here for Montreal at 10.30 a.m.
