TORONTO, April 23.—11 p.m.—Pressure is low over the Northwest States, Manitoba and Eastern Canada, and comparatively high over Ontario and the Southern States. Showers have occurred in Quebec and the Maritime Provinces. Elsewhere the weather has been fine.

Minimum and maximum temperatures: Calgary, 38—62; u'Appelle, 42—68; Winnipeg, 42—70; Parry Sound, 34—44; Toronto, 39—52; Montreal, 36—42; Quebec, 39—42; Halifax, 36—46.

—At Osgoode Hall Tuesday: Fletcher vs. Fletcher—Judgment on appeals, heard at London by the plaintiff, and by the infant defendants, and by the defendant Malcolm Fletcher, and on motion by plaintiff for confirmation, distribution and costs. Appeal of defendant, Malcolm Fletcher, allowed with costs. Appeals of plaintiff and infant defendants dismissed. No costs of the action of this appeal to any of the parties, costs of the first appeal to be paid by the plaintiff. The plaintiff to pay the costs of the infant defendants. The allowance by the master of \$150 commission to administrator is confirmed; but, as there is no fund out of which to pay it, no order is made in respect of it.

SOWING THE SEED.

Seeding is going forward very rapidly throughout the country now. The season is rather late, but the weather is excellent for the work, and the bulk of the seed will likely be sown before the middle of last week.

THE ALDERMANIC SHAKE-UP.

The judgment in Ald. O'Meara's case unseats Ald. Powell. Justice Meredith decided that if O'Meara's resignation was held to be binding, leaving only three candidates at the time of election, Mr. Powell should have been elected by acclamation, and the fact of his being a school trustee would not influence his election in that event. On the other hand, if the withdrawal of O'Meara's resignation was lawful, there remained four candidates in the field and a poll was necessary. In this case Ald. Powell's position as High School trustee would debar him from running. As Ald. O'Meara was sustained, therefore Ald. Powell loses his seat.

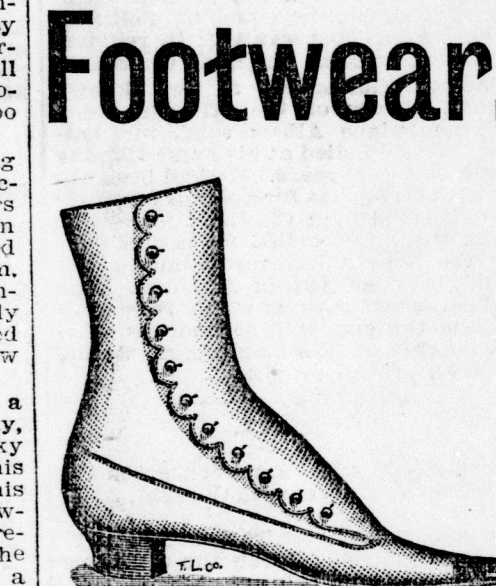

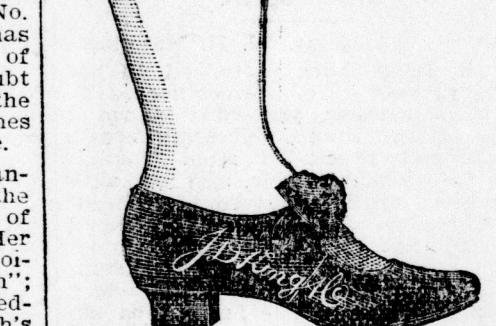

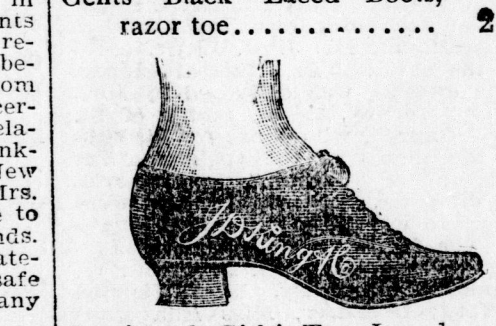
