THE BRITISH ADVANCE

Described in Detail—Excellent Moral Effect in the Sudan.

New York, April 14.—A dispatch to the Herald from Wady Halfa, Egypt, says that the British Government has been strongly garrisoned. The railway between these points is being pushed forward as rapidly as possible. When the line has been already laid, and the track will be completed along the course laid down in 1884, in order to pass the cataracts. For the guard of the railway, strong posts have been established on the Nile at Semneh, Wady Ambigol, Tangur, and Soud. Each of these posts has been supplied with a contingent to guard the point opposite to it on the line, as it is laid in order to prevent the Dervishes from destroying the works.

The Dervishes at Starda, who number three thousand, have advanced their posts to Morakkeh, distant fifteen miles from Akaschah, and have been strongly garrisoned. The main body of the Dervishes still remaining at Dongola. The moral effect of the announcement of the expedition has been excellent in the Sudan, and has been of the utmost service to the Italians at Kassala. Newspaper correspondents at Akaschah have been prevented from going beyond Sarra.
