GOES TO COBOURG

Dr. W. T. Wilson Made Superintendent of the Asylum There.

Toronto, Nov. 5.—It was announced this afternoon that Dr. W. T. Wilson, assistant superintendent of the Toronto asylum, has been appointed to the superintendency of the asylum at Cobourg. This position was made vacant about a month ago through the death of Dr. C. E. Hickey. Dr. Wilson has spent some thirteen years in the provincial asylum service, having been at Kingston, Brockville, Mimico, London, Hamilton and Toronto. He has always been counted an especially efficient officer.

SPENT MILLION ON TARS

Amoy, China, Nov. 5.—The second squadron of the American battleship fleet which, under the command of Rear Admiral Emery, has been in Amoy since Oct. 20 as the guest of the Government of China, brought its visit to a close this morning, when at 8 o'clock it steamed out of the harbor, bound for Olongapo, Luzon. In the Philippines it will join the first squadron under Admiral Sperry. The distance to Olongapo is about 700 miles, and the vessels should reach there early on the morning of Nov. 8.

The departing warships were given a demonstration in marked contrast to the apathy which was noticeable on their arrival.

The cost of the reception here has exceeded \$1,000,000. The Chinese Government has been lavish in its gifts to the American officers and men, and at the final official function on shore last night the entertainments afforded by the Chinese Government were declared by the Americans to have been, with the exception of Australia, second to none.
