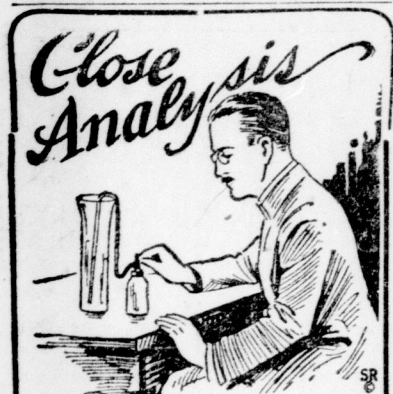
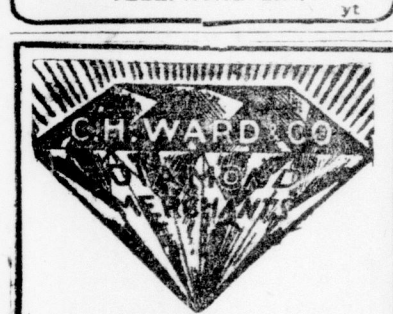

GOOD VAUDEVILLE BILL SHOWN AT LOEW'S THEATRE

"Stephen Steps Out," With Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., Fine Picture.

BALANCED PROGRAM

To be correct, a graph of the vaudeville at Loew's will indicate this week's bill by means of a quality line hovering near the top. It would seem that the promise of "Better Vaudeville" is a light that didn't fall. From the ranks of mediocrity, the three acts showing just now step forth with great brilliancy.
"The Weiss Troup" who open the bill have about the best act. Yesterday's audiences didn't have the slightest hesitation in showing their approval. One unusual feature about this act is that the combination of "strong-man" and artistic violinist isn't exactly a common one.
Glenn and Richards have about average ability, but an adeptness in setting forth what they can do, which doesn't in the least belong to the average. The lady has a nice voice, and the dancing isn't bad. For the rest—the act is well-devised, written with originality and it hasn't been allowed to lose anything in the presentation.
Revue Headliner.
Miss Hall's Revue is the headliner. Miss Hall herself would seem a trifle too ready to edge the other members of the company out of the spotlight and with a slightly angular albeit smiling bow accept the applause offered them. The lullaby song yesterday was the big hit of the act, but the spotlight flashed back to Miss Hall's smile, and not the rather pretty young lady who sang it. The blackface comedy is good, and so is the little girl with her song. The white costumes are not becoming, nor do they noticeably add to the effectiveness of the scenery.
"Stephen Steps Out," a film adaptation of a story by Richard Harding Davis is the feature picture. It is a lucky find as the first vehicle for Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., because it gives him an opportunity to show that he possesses the smile, the walk, inherited from his paternal ancestor, together with a promising measure of that same athletic ability which he develops, without stressing too much the fact that Douglas, Jr., is still immature, and with no marked ability as an actor.
Engaging Lad.
Douglas, Sr., has no need to feel embarrassed on his son's account. He is an engaging lad. It isn't a matter of much question that the smile will become more prepossessing, and that the athletic ability will develop, and the screen will become possessed of two Douglases, the one vying with the other.
Apart from the fact that it introduces young Fairbanks, "Stephen Steps Out" is a first-class picture. There is humor, interest, action, and it demonstrates forcibly that a picture can be a real picture and yet get along without a lovely heroine, be she blonde or brunette, because there is only one woman in it, and she only incidental.
Theodore Roberts, Noah Beery, and Harry Myers are among an excellent cast.
There are two short pictures, one of the Fighting Blood series, and a Pathe Weekly, one of the interesting shots in the latter being Miss Lois Booth of Ottawa and her royal fiancé, caught in a truly democratic scene.

DR. MCCAIG GIVES INTERESTING TALK HOME RELATIONS

In Adelaide St. Baptist Church Last Night Before Large Congregation.

ADAPTATION ESSENTIAL
Last night, in the Adelaide Street Baptist Church, under the head of "Nagging Wives and Overbearing Husbands," Dr. J. Aspinall McCaig discussed the matter of the adaptation of the man and the woman in the marriage relationship.
"Adjustment and adaptation are always essential," he declared, "where parts are combined to make a working whole, and the adjustment of a man and a woman for the proper performance of the functions of the family involves physical and mental and spiritual adaptation."
The common impediments to easy adjustment in the marriage relationship were declared to be, first, that the man and woman have different tendencies; second, that they each have lived many years under different molding conditions; and, third, that they both have a tendency to clinging to self from childhood, considering self even in the choice of each other, and each capable of continuing self-existence after the death of the other.
These impediments to a happy adjustment were asserted to be insuperable unless there be certain essentials of adaptation: "Sex affinity," declared Dr. McCaig, "is not sufficient."
The essentials of adaptation were stated to be, first, the instinctive subjugation of the ego in each in favor of the other, commonly known as the condition of love; second, the practice of transposition by which they endeavor to see things from each other's standpoint; third, the recognition of the varying superiority in each, and fourth, the acceptance of marriage as a love relationship to be maintained in integrity only by a continuance of those subtle acts of love that made courtship a delight.
In the arrangement of the forces that operate against harmonious married life, Dr. McCaig cited as forces positively hostile to adaptation any outside influence encroaching upon the home, such as the permanent presence in the home during the first year of married life of either the man's mother or the woman's mother. Controlling passions and appetites, and ambitions that do not converge in the home were also cited in this connection.
Against these Dr. McCaig set forth the influences that were of a comforting character, tending to draw the man and woman together, such as seasons of companionship, common ambitions and the income of the little child.
"Courtship and Woman's Love" will be Dr. McCaig's subject tonight at 8 o'clock in the King Street Presbyterian Church, when he will deliver the second of his popular lectures on marriage.
This afternoon at 3 o'clock in the Adelaide Street Church he will give the second of his special lectures to women on home standards. "The Care of the Boy" will be this afternoon's subject.
All of these addresses are community lectures, non-sectarian and free to all.

LOWER FREIGHT RATES.

Victoria, B.C., Jan. 14.—Unification of Western Canada in a concerted demand for lower rates on freight is the object of Premier Oliver's trip to Edmonton this week, he said today.

CLERK APPOINTED FOR WESTMINSTER
E. S. Hunt, Veteran Assessor and Tax Collector, Named For Office.
E. S. Hunt, for 23 years assessor of Westminster Township and tax collector for the past 32 years, was unanimously appointed clerk by the Westminster Township councilors at the first meeting of the year, held in the county buildings yesterday afternoon. His salary was fixed at \$400 a year.
Other appointments made by the council were: J. W. Laidlaw, treasurer, at a salary of \$450 per year; W. E. Grievie, trustee, \$85 per annum; A. Moody and R. W. Milne, auditors, \$35 each per annum; C. G. Vanslyke, tax collector, \$400 per year, and J. H. Anderson, assessor, \$450 per year.
There were half a dozen applications for relief made by residents of Manor Park. One party was given an order for half a ton of coal, while the other petitions for help were turned over to Reeve Laidlaw and Deputy-Reeve Boier to investigate and take action if necessary.
Petitions were received from Glanworth and Lambeth, asking the council to hold their bi-monthly meetings in those places. The matter was laid over for a month, when definite action will be taken.

"BREEZY TIMES" IS HIGH VARIETY OF BURLESQUE

Splendid Comedy and Dancing Feature Offering at Grand.

HUMOROUS PLAYLETS

"Breezy Times," the burlesque showing at the Grand Theatre, is a riot of fun. Comedy, singing and dancing of an exceptional order are here extravagantly rendered, and the variety of numbers and costumes combine to place it several notches higher than the average standard of productions shown on the Columbia circuit.
The contagious comedy distilled by George Leon and Jamie Coughlin contributes much toward the mirth of the audience. Leon is the boisterous, exuberant type, while Coughlin presents a nicely modulated contrast with his unassuming humor. The skit, "Giving the Baby the Air," shows the former at his best in the role of an essentially really human but ridiculous policeman.
"The Silent Sanatorium" is a well-thought-out, distinctly original slapstick attempt which is uproarious in spots. The comedians resort to every trick on the calendar from punning to horse-play, and everyone, if laughter is a barometer of judgment, proves eminently entertaining.
Dancing talent is well distributed in "Breezy Times," but Earl Mossman is the prize-winning toe artist of the group. This heel-and-toe expert performs with rare facility, few dancers having appeared in the city who could move their legs with the trip-hammer quickness and eloquence of Mossman. The show comprises several burlesque playlets, including "A Matrimonial Storm," which shows Charles Wesson and Jamie Coughlin at their best. The double dancing performance of this pair with one of them doing the shadow part behind a huge cloak draws rounds of applause.
Bedini and Arthur are a pair of jugglers who manipulate china crockery with experienced hands and leave their act with enough humor to make it interesting. The well-known argument that the instinct to laugh is more readily brought out when a man loses his hat or when he is hit on the head with a brick was tried with success by the management of "Breezy Times." Each time Fred Leon is snatched over the jaw the audience roars.
Two good girl dancers add zest to the performance. The men, however, make up the heavy part of the show doing their jobs with lots of vitality and enthusiasm.
"Breezy Times" is a liberal dose of froth which everyone in the audience is bound to enjoy.
