



Bow They Work it. WESTMINSTER, Md., Sept. 14. — Interest in the graveyard insurance companies is in areasing. In Carroll county farmers are mortgaging their farms to raise money for premiums. A negro named Watson, aged 78, is living in luxary and suppering pili-cies of insurance on his life in favor of speculators, who paid him \$20 to \$100 per policy. Watson is partially paralyzed and suffering from rheumatism and heart dis-ease. The policies on his life aggregate \$200,000. He has signed one hundred pol-isies, and more are being taken out daily. The premiums on these policies are anor-mous, some of the companies charging \$100 a week for every \$1000. These premiums are ruining the holders of policies. This is only a sample of dozens of cases in western Maryland. The records of the county court show an astonishing increase of mortgages field, and it is accepted as an evidence of graveyard speculation for a farmer to mort-gage properly. The policies are taken out through secret agents of the companies, all of which are located in small towns just beyond the Pennsylvania line. The new civil and criminal codes of Japan go into effect is January next. They are modelled on the code Napoleon, with local adaptation. The French system of gen-d'armes has been adopted.
