Although we have still to record considerable depression in commercial affairs in this City, we are glad to note a more cheerful feeling in relation to the future. Our merchants look with hopefulness to the various mining districts for an improvement in the present somewhat dull state of trade, and from present appearances they are likely to realize their most sanguine expectations.

The transactions of the week have been on a very limited scale, principally confined to City requirements; the weather in British Columbia continues severe, and locomotion for the time is next to impossible.

Last season, a merchant from Mexico induced by the advantages held out to buyers by our free port in this market, visited this City, and we are glad to find that he has profited so well by his first adventure, that he has instructed his agents here to supplement his order for various kinds of goods, which will to a great extent be supplied.

The Estimates presented a few days ago to the House of Assembly here, contain one item which, if passed, will be of the greatest benefit to our commercial community, viz.:—a vote of \$30,000 towards the establishment of direct mail communication with Panama; no opposition is expected on the part of our representatives; such a line of steamers will call on their way at the different Mexican ports, as well as at San Francisco, will enable us to fill with ease any orders we may receive from those ports.

In *Grain* and *Flour* we have little change to note, Golden Gate is nominally held at \$14, but we believe lower prices would be accepted.

Machinery about the same. *Hardware* and *Holloware* continue heavy. *Barthoware* moving off slowly.

Sugar the market is bare of all descriptions, with little prospect of a large increase to stocks for some time to come.

Blended and Printed Cottons are small in stock, and the latter may be quoted at 22 cents. *Clothing* of all descriptions is much in excess of any probable demand during the coming season. In *Huck* and *Linen* little doing. *Carpeting* quiet, Brussels, Tapestry and Velvet have been the only kinds saleable, but of late stocks have been heavy, and dealers have been fully supplied from sales at auction, whose prices have ruled low. *Hemp matting* and *carpeting* are very dull of sale.

The "General Wyndham," 119 days out, has just arrived, all well. She brings a great increase to our stocks of Wines and Spirits which are already very large. At the last sale by auction Hennessy and Martell in case \$9.50; but as these parcels were principally taken by the small dealers, no criterion can be formed. Oilmen's stores are heavy, Crosse and Blackwell's brands being the most saleable.

In lumber the market is well supplied, and the Alberni Saw Mills have stopped work for the present, the logging season being over.

The Princess Royal will be due here in February, after which we expect no further arrivals from London or Liverpool before May or June.
