What is the way out of the difficulty? The journal then recommends Zanardelli. If he seeks a temporary and ineffective remedy, to go on in his ordinary way of patching up a Ministry that may give the country a period of tranquillity but if he seeks for a positive change of the present situation, "turn to God!"

These words are the expression of the repentance some Liberals feel for the crimes and errors of half-a-century past, under the circumstances, it is almost hopeless to expect Zanardelli turning to God. It is a sad picture, and there are elements of truth in it.
