

How To Apply? Application for an Employment Authorization may be made at any Canadian port of entry or Canadian Consulate. The Transferee must provide proof of citizenship and identity and a letter from the company (in Canada or in the United States) which clearly confirms qualification for this status. The application fee is (Cdn)\$75.00.

PROFESSIONALS

Who? U.S. Professionals whose occupation or profession is listed in the box on this page.

What Activities Are Covered? Professionals must be travelling to Canada to work temporarily in the profession for which they are qualified.

How To Apply? Entry may be sought at any Canadian port of entry or Canadian Consulate. Qualified applicants will be issued an Employment Authorization.

Applicants must provide proof of U.S. citizenship and identity, along with a letter from the Canadian employer and supporting documents which show the nature and length of the activity to be engaged in, the arrangements for remuneration, and educational or other appropriate professional credentials. A processing fee of (Cdn)\$75.00 is payable upon application.

TRADERS AND INVESTORS

Who? A Trader works in a U.S.-owned or controlled firm in Canada that carries on substantial trade in goods or services, principally between the United States and Canada.

An Investor has invested or is in the process of investing a substantial amount of capital in an enterprise in Canada.

What Activities Are Covered? A Trader must hold a position that is supervisory or executive, or involves skills essential to the operation of the firm in Canada.

An Investor develops and directs the operation of the enterprise.

How To Apply? Application for an Employment Authorization must be made at a Canadian Consulate before leaving for Canada. The Trader or Investor must provide proof of citizenship and identity, and documents which clearly confirm qualification for this status. The processing fee is (Cdn)\$75.00, payable upon application.

It is the responsibility of the prospective employer and the professional to ensure compliance with licencing requirements.

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
