OTTAWA, May 22, 1952.

Sir:

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your Note No. 24 of May 9th, 1952, regarding extension of the Canada-United Kingdom Double Taxation Agreement of June 5th, 1946, with respect to income tax to the Governments of British Guiana and St. Lucia, which reads as follows:

(See Note I)

"I have the honour in the Canada Gazette"

2. The terms of the foregoing note are acceptable to the Canadian Government, and I have the honour to confirm that your note under reference, together with my present reply thereto, shall be regarded as putting on record the agreement of the two Governments that the Double Taxation Agreement as modified shall apply to the two territories named on the sixtieth day after May 9th, 1952.

3. I also wish to inform you that the Canadian Government has no objection to the publication of this exchange of notes in the London Gazette and to the release of an appropriate announcement to the United Kingdom press. The Canadian authorities, for their part, propose to have the present exchange of notes published in the Canada Gazette and to issue a brief statement to the Canadian press.
