CYPRUS AT A GLANCE

Cyprus-Canada Relations:

- Canada was a major contributor to the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus
 (UNFICYP) from 1964-1993 when Canada maintained a battalion-sized contingent of soldiers on
 the Island. More than 50,000 Canadians served in Cyprus during that period, which claimed the
 lives of 28.
- Two-way trade between Cyprus and Canada was CAD\$11.1 million in 2003.
- Canada and Cyprus work together through their shared membership in the UN, OSCE, and the Commonwealth.
- Cyprus and Canada have signed a number agreements including air transport and double taxation.
- In June, 2002, Secretary of State for Central and Eastern Europe and the Middle East, Gar Knutson, led a successful business delegation to **Cyprus**.

Canada, Cyprus and the European Union:

- Canada and Cyprus will both benefit from the innovative Canada-EU Trade and Investment Enhancement Agreement (TIEA) that seeks to stimulate bilateral trade and investment, trade facilitation and sustainable development.
- Canada and Cyprus will work together on EU issues of common interest identified in the Canada-EU Partnership Agenda, including people-to-people links, global governance, promotion of prosperity, and international security.
- Canada, Cyprus, and the EU seek a mutually acceptable negotiated settlement under the auspices
 of the UN Secretary General, to achieve peace, stability, and prosperity in a reunited Cyprus.
- Through the EU, Euro-Atlantic links provide an important means to promote relations, building on the existing ties between the expatriate communities living in Cyprus and Canada.
