Ordered,—That consideration of the motion standing in the name of the honourable Member for St. John's East (Mr. McGrath), That the First Report of the Special Committee on Egg Marketing presented to the House on Monday, December 16, 1974, be concurred in, be considered as the first item of business under "Orders of the Day".

Mr. Sharp, seconded by Mr. Drury, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-51, An Act to increase the representation of the Northwest Territories in the House of Commons and to establish a commission to readjust the electoral boundaries of the Northwest Territories, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Governor General pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Governor General recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act to establish a representation commission for the Northwest Territories.

Mr. Chrétien, seconded by Mr. Mackasey, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-52, An Act to amend the Public Service Superannuation Act, the Canadian Forces Superannuation Act, the Defence Services Pension Continuation Act, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act, the Diplomatic Service (Special) Superannuation Act, the Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act, the Governor General's Retiring Annuity Act, the Judges Act, the Tax Review Board Act and the Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Governor General pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Governor General recommends to the House of Commons a measure
