some system in every province, including Prince Edward Island and Quebec, for the consideration of these divorce bills. The cost, as compared with the cost in coming to parliament, would not be as great. However, the costs are so great that in some of the provinces the high court judges want to have divorces referred to the county court judges.

I believe the government should lay down some policy with respect to these bills. The way we are transacting this business does not do credit to parliament. In the old country the churches have been examining into this matter for a long time, and they have held a conference in connection with it. I hear that in our procedure we are following the practice of the United States. Surely the government should adopt a concrete policy with respect to divorce bills.
