been in first place they have dropped to fourth place. The two opposition Parties are well ahead of them in the polls, then come the undecided, and then comes the Conservative Party at somewhere around 20 per cent. With that level of public confidence, they are going to make massive fundamental changes in the structure of the economy and privatize Air Canada and Petro-Canada. That should not be allowed to happen. That is not a democratic procedure. Because those people lack logic in their operations we really should have an election. I hope logic will return to the individuals on the other side. I hope they will join with the Opposition in supporting this very worth-while amendment to the legislation before us. Possibly the Hon. Member for Simcoe North (Mr. Lewis) will rise in his place and overrule the Minister. That would show that the people on that side of the House have regained their reason, logic will prevail, and this amendment will pass.
