OBJECT TO PURCHASE OF CADET UNIFORMS

Board of Education Scored by Ossington District Ratepayers' Association.

At a meeting of the Ossington District Ratepayers' Association last night a resolution was passed requesting the board of control to proceed immediately with the work of grading the subway from Geary avenue north.

Letters were read from the works department regarding the progress of the various works in the district.

Regarding the delay in building subways under the C.P.R. tracks it was stated that the department expected to get Bathurst, Christie and Shaw street subways paved this year and some improvement made in sidewalks on Ossington avenue and Dovecourt road.

It was also stated that no grading can be done at the present time on the Tyrrel and Denison avenues as all the property had not yet been purchased, but a recommendation was being prepared for submission to the works committee authorizing the grading of Ben son avenue.
